**We are investing in FCPS teachers and staff to improve student achievement.**

Focus on **six schools** in one feeder pattern: Arlington, Northern, Russell Cave and Mary Todd elementaries; Winburn Middle School, and Bryan Station HS; over **4,500 students** served

**Building Bridges to Opportunity:** provides support, opportunity, and resources for those affected by gun violence; scholarships for college and nontraditional skills development; mentoring services, and trauma-informed care services for students and family members affected by gun violence. In partnership with One Lexington.
